STRATEGY:

- Select a variety of plants and trees to increase disease, pest and climate change resiliency.
- Prioritize native plants and avoid invasives.
- Create structural diversity. Employ plants of different heights and forms (trees, shrubs, ornamental grasses, groundcovers). Landscapes with more structural diversity have greater visual interest, support more wildlife such as pollinators and beneficial insects that provide the services of pollination and pest control.

CONCEPT B



Privacy planting composed of Cryptomeria, Green Giant Arborvitae and Deciduous tree with flowering shrubs and grasses.
